



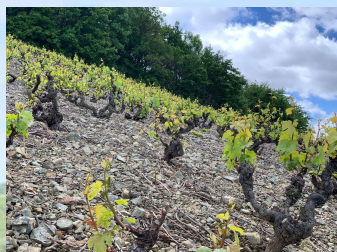
DOMAINE D'ARGENSON



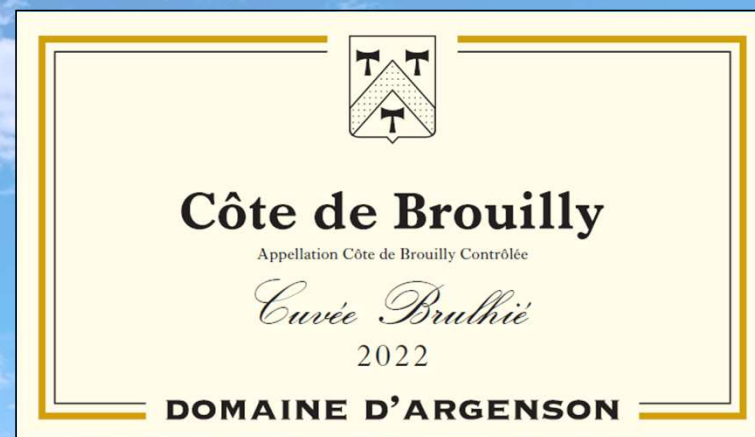
2.2 hectare plot located between 290 and 347 m above sea level, facing south, in the immediate vicinity of the vatage.



$\frac{3}{4}$ old vines planted in 1950, goblet pruned, partially trellised.



Soils characterized by the presence of stones of eruptive origin. Manual harvest.



Single-plot cuvée from our historic plot, “at the end of the garden”. Its name comes from the Roman lieutenant Brulius, who received this hill as a reward for his victories. Since ancient times, it has been a land of vines.

To the eye: garnet color.

On the nose: bouquet of red and black fruits, with a hint of vanilla.

In the mouth: Very fine and melted attack; good length in the mouth on the aromas.
